Cracked Radiator. Upstairs in the Children's Room we are in need of a long-term fix. Right now we just have that radiator turned off. Josh (Town Maintenance) is looking into options. The radiator will most likely need to be replaced, but it is not an item easily available.

# Programs - Recent:

- January 11 Allen Davis hosted a panel discussion on race in Franklin County with three Black Greenfield residents, Jeanne Hall, Gloria Matlock, and Dick Hall. 65 people came to the panel discussion. 15 people came to the small group follow-up.
- January 13 Cate Woolner hosted a show and tell of her social justice tour through museums, etc. in Alabama and Georgia. 30 people attended.
- January 25 We are co-hosting a program on the ABC's of beginning genealogy with Montague Public Libraries.
- December's Take and Make was a waddling penguin craft. 36 went home with kids.
- We have had movie night kits, each including movies on a theme, hot cocoa, and popcorn. 35 went home with families and adults. Families have loved these!
- We sent Lego kits home with kids in lieu of Kids' Fridays. 20 went home with kids from the library. 26 went to NES for kids to use in the classroom to the happy third graders! Matt has also created an animal scavenger hunt. Kids pick up a sheet of clues and look for animals hidden around the library.
- Attendance is catching up with Julie's online story time. We had 4 families join in this morning.
- Spice Club sent 22 spice samples home with patrons. The spice was Sumac.

# February Programs (all virtual and take-away):

- Feb 2 Valentines day card kits will be available for pickup.
- Feb 3 Spice Club spice samples will be available. The spice is nigella.
- Feb 10 We will start Blind Date with a Book for adults. Books will be wrapped with a hint as to what they are.
- Feb 15 We co-host another genealogy program with Montague.
- Feb 19 For winter break, kids will be able to pick up custom book boxes. They
  fill out a personality test the week before and then Matt will custom choose a
  book for them. The book goes home with a few little treats in the box as well.
  Personality tests are being sent home through NES.
- Feb 23 An introduction to Northfield trails with Julie from the Open Space Committee.
- Feb 24 We will host a breastfeeding chat with Dr. Lindiwe Sibeko. This is in support of a study that UMass is doing on breastfeeding nutrition and includes ten libraries.

#### 5. OTHER BUSINESS

Fundraising. We are hoping to have an idea of some people to work with and to be in touch with them by March. Misha will reach out to contacts at the Greenfield and Shelburne Falls Public Libraries.

'Museum Collection' Updates. First, Misha has been contacted by a reporter about the human remains we used to have in the library. The reporter said that NAGPRA (Native American Graves Protection and Repatriation Act) shows that the library still has these remains though we do not. Misha has been working through our records as well as UMass records through the repatriation coordinator there. Last week, the Northfield Historical Commission was also involved. Together there is now almost a complete story and documentation. Once that is complete we can contact NAGPRA to have the inventory amended. Second, last month Misha reported that our collection on Indigenous artifacts could be going to UMass to be cataloged this semester but it has been decided by the Northfield Historical Commission that it would be best if they stay here at the library. Our Director will be working with Bee Jacque and Joe Graveline to learn more and provide context for patrons for the items in another way, while also gaining guidance for respectful and appropriate management of next steps.
