Discussed "urgency" based on erosion concerns and limited availability of the North Quabbin Trails labor force. Joanne McGee joined meeting to present information and answer questions.

FINAL request is for CPC to fund \$1,290 of a total project cost of \$1,390.

Continued discussion as to how to categorize these projects; Steeple is mostly Historical but the Swan Project can be categorized as Recreation/Community or Historical as it is representative of both.

<u>1st PARISH STEEPLE</u> Project updated/modified submission which is now just painting of the steeple containing the Town Clock. Painting which is required as part of extensive repairs being performed on the steeple due to damage suspect cause by lightning strike. Original repairs are covered by 1st Parish Insurance Co with 1st Parish covering \$5,000 deductible and \$1,031.48 depreciation.

FINAL request is for CPC to fund \$14,000 for the final painting of the steeple down to the church roof line.

MOTION made by Tony Matteo, seconded by Mary King, for CPC to fund \$14,000, seconded and unanimously APPROVED.

TM noted the CPC has a great deal of unencumbered funds, and that using part of it to repair the steeple will help the town. It was noted [Mary?] that the Massachusetts Historical Commission often funds church-related structural projects that don't relate to any religious practices. BH said that the CPC should still use caution, because one could argue that by funding the construction work, it would free up the church's funding, which they can use for religious programming.

Further discussion included the possible existence of funding guidelines, and how much money the CPC currently has in its various funding accounts.
