# COMMUNITY PRESERVATION COMMITTEE THURSDAY, MARCH 5, 2021 REGULAR MEETING - 6:05PM REMOTE LOCATION MEETING MINUTES

#### CALL TO ORDER AND WELCOME

Chair LD called the meeting to order at 6:13pm.

#### I. DISCUSS NES PTO PLAYGROUND PAVILION PROPOSAL & VOTE

LD gave a brief history of the CPC's deliberation on this proposal, and noted the vote is tabled pending the PTO's response to the CPC's questions about community scheduling and clean-up.

	Use of the pavilion is on a first-come, first-served basis.
	The PTO will display signage about clean-up.
.00	There will be no trash receptacles on-site.
	The PTO consulted with Town Secretary Sandra Wood on how the town arranges for the community's use of the Wickey Pavilion.
A disc	cussion ensued. Highlights included:
	Bathrooms and trash.
	Other town outdoor facilities that do not offer on-site bathrooms.
	The parameters of CPC funding, and, that this project, although not about preservation, is about recreational open space, which qualifies it for consideration.
	The town stipulated that this project cannot be built without having a licensed contractor overseeing the construction.
	It is within the CPC's purview to ask for project updates.
	There is enough money in the CPC's budget (approximately \$160,000) to entirely fund this project, and that more funding will come to the CPC next year. Additional funding will soon arrive from a project that is returning some of its money to the CPC.
	The schedule of when the CPC's funding gets disbursed to the CPC, and how that affects the
	CPC's access of money for projects.
	The proximity of the proposed pavilion to other town amenities.
	The Recreation Commission's relationship to this project.
	Whether the town is responsible for repairs to the proposed pavilion.
Aq	The cost of the proposal.
	The proposal's plans.

Possible stipulations to funding the proposal.
The CPC's process for deciding, and what to communicate to applicants when the CPC denies
their application.

MOTION BY RC THAT THE CPC VOTE ON THE PAVILION PROPOSAL, EITHER WITH "NO" BECAUSE IT IS NOT A FINISHED APPLICATION, OR "YES" WITH STIPULATIONS.

The motion was not seconded. TM objected to the wording of the motion.

#### MOTION FAILED.

MOTION BY TM TO APPROVE THE PTO'S NES PAVILION APPLICATION WITH PROVISIONS, AND FOR NO MONEY TO BE EXPENDED UNTIL THOSE PROVISIONS ARE MET.

The motion was not seconded. LD objected to the lack of clarity on the provisions.

#### MOTION FAILED.

MOTION BY JS TO DENY THE PTO'S NES PLAYGROUND APPLICATION BECAUSE IT IS INCOMPLETE, AND TO ENCOURAGE THEM TO RETURN NEXT YEAR. LM SECONDED.

A discussion ensued.

MOTION BY RC TO AMEND THE JS MOTION TO CHANGE "PLAYGROUND" TO "PAVILION," AND TO CHANGE "NEXT YEAR" TO "A FUTURE DATE." TM SECONDED. MOTION CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY.

A discussion ensued. LD reminded committee members that a "yea" vote means the application is denied, and a "nay" vote means LD will enumerate their concerns to the PTO, and get the CPC's approval for them.

#### AMENDED MOTION (MADE BY JS; SECONDED BY LM) CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY.

LD called for a five-minute break at 7:46pm. The meeting resumed at 7:54pm.

## II. DISCUSS PROPOSED POLICY ABOUT ACCEPTING PROPOSALS FOR WORK ALREADY STARTED OR COMPLETED & VOTE

LD noted the state CPC regulations. LD read the proposed policy into the record:

"State CPA legislation prohibits reimbursing work that has already been funded, started or completed on municipal assets.

Northfield CPA proposals requesting additional funding/reimbursement of work that has already been completed on private property will be considered only under the following conditions:

- The reimbursement proposal must be for work done as part of a previously approved Northfield CPA proposal in which the project ran into unexpected, unforeseen, and emergency problems.

- The already completed work must have happened within one year of the start of the previously approved proposal work.
- The Northfield CPC must be notified within 30 days of when the unexpected need for more funds has been discovered. Financial documentation and a description of why the overage should be considered for additional funding/reimbursement will be required at this time."

A discussion ensued on the proposal.
