#### Presentation from Jacque

 Spoke with Deerfield Selectboard member Carolyn Ness and the Director of the Pioneer Valley Mosquito Control District

### OVERVIEW

Communication with other towns & the Pioneer Valley Mosquito District indicate opting out of aerial spraying is more complicated than first thought. While we focus on spraying, we should not lose sight of mosquito adaptability and the decline of their predators (birds, bats, dragonflies, frogs, spiders, & others) as the larger "root issue." Below is my understanding of what I've read & heard — my goal is to give a sense of the challenge and point to decisions & actions to be considered.

#### MOSQUITOES

- o 50+ species in Massachusetts
- They adapt now active during day not just dusk/dawn
- Wet, rainy weather is not a simple predictor wet conditions are important for breeding (especially WNV), but some mosquitoes like dry conditions & dry conditions (even dry days) can cause an increase in biting (dehydrated mosquitoes seek blood)
- o Zika mosquito is making its way north
- o 2019 was a big year for EEE risk (the Town of Heath lost a person)

#### MOSQUITO CONTROL

- Year-round for the most part
- o Important & more effective to control early & all stages in mosquito life cycle
- Spraying, especially aerial, is costly & less effective
- Spraying in 2020 occurred in Southeastern Massachusetts

#### PIONEER VALLEY MOSQUITO DISTRICT

- o \$5K is the minimum & covers surveillance & testing plus educational assistance from the Director
- Unlike other districts, funding is "voluntary contribution" vs "cherry sheet"
- Voluntary means towns in this district can pick & choose services
- Shoestring budget one employee, no physical space
- Requires a town vote (not sure if annual vs special is relevant)
- Given the new state program and the interest of towns in joining, the district should be funded at a higher level to provide add'l employees or contractors & physical space (e.g., storage)

# • STATE

- July 2020 kicked off the new legislation/program, but specific regs didn't begin to roll out until Spring 2021
- Not all the details are known the 2-year state task force created releases its findings in August 2021
- "Exclusion" is/was a term used before "opt-out" seems to be a new term & has captured all the attention, especially absent other details
- o Organic farmers & property owners (based on size of property) can apply for exclusion individually
- Education alone does not seem to be an acceptable plan for opting out it seems to be "required" so the state can make education mandatory

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If the state declares an emergency, it is possible they could mandate spraying anyway & bill opted-out towns

### NORTHFIELD

- Our low/remote risk designation by the state is based on geography, proximity to other towns, & possibly, occasional tests from the DPH
- o If we were next to Heath in 2019, for example, our risk level would have been Moderate (Yellow)
- o If we had one person with EEE or WNV, our risk level would be Critical (Red)
- To effectively manage the health risk & to deal with the state, we need multi-year data on mosquito species in our town & where they exist
- In managing & adapting a plan each year, as well as educating the public, the Board of Health would need funding
- In dealing with culverts & standing water, and applying control measures like bactericide rings, the Highway Dept would need funding
- We are not currently part of the FRCOG Pollinator Program

## • RECOMMENDATIONS / CONSIDERATIONS

- Ask FRCOG to set up a meeting with towns & delegation impact on towns, funding for towns, funding for District, funding for proactive measures
- Evaluate August 2021 results from state task force
- o Use Town Meeting to present plan & its funding requirements
- o Make sure plan deals with how & when spraying would or would not occur
- Possibly create a bylaw or policy to address spraying
- Identify the opportunity to engage on proactive measures to address the decline of mosquito predators — role of community & other committees
- o Recommended not opting out due to risk with no plan in place
- Karen Boudreau of the Board of Health joined the discussion
  - Asked when the last time Northfield was sprayed and how decision will be made to opt out
    - Discussion on developing plan with Board of Health and possibly holding special town meeting in the fall for funding.
    - Llamas to reach out to FRCOG for possible regional assistance
    - o Risk too great if opt out without a plan
    - Plan requires 5 years of data

## Decision

- Not enough information or data to process before the deadline
- Plan for next town meeting; education for Board of Health; identify problem areas
  - Resident John Schuster added his comments on the lack of info and short time frame from the state
- Motion by Cummings, seconded by Meisner the board voted to not opt out of the mosquito spraying program due to lack of time and availability.
  - o Possibly create a subcommittee
  - o Keep moving forward to get a plan in place
  - o Collect questions from Board of Health and Selectboard and concerns, bring to Llamas

#### Next steps

- Develop plan
- Source funding for possible participation in Mosquito District or other groups available, Highway department and Board of Health
- Questions to Llamas
