- **Pole Hearing convened at 6:04 pm:** Petition One: Under the provisions of Chapter 166 of general Laws and any additions thereto, or amendments thereof, the Board of Selectmen will hold a Public Hearing on May 15, 2018 at 6:00 pm on the petition of Eversource to install one (1) solely owned new mid span pole with associated guying to reduce span length for re-conductor project on Birnam Rd. AND Petition Two: to install two (2) fully owned new mid span poles, with associated guying on Hamilton Rd. and to install six (6) fully owned new mid span poles, with associated guying on Pierson Rd. to reduce span length for re-conductor project. Held at Town Hall, 69 Main St. Northfield, MA

- Eversource representative Nick Criegle explained the technology upgrades for safety reasons necessitated the request. No trees are to be removed, only trimming. Work to be completed by the end of the year.
- On a motion by Rogers, seconded by Blyth the board voted to grant petitions 1 and 2 to install poles.
