New Business

- Four Mile Brook Rd issues
 - Dan Ryan addressed a tree concern at the end of the road. Tom Walker, Superintendent of Streets & Building Maintenance said wetlands permit has been filed. Tree on private property. May hear back on permit in mid-November.
 - Bob Duby of the Four Mile Brook Watershed Advisory Committee addressed the board asking about a rumor about plans to widen the road in sections. The FMBWAC is not in favor of the road being widened and if it is widened their opinion is that it will serve as a shortcut to Rte. 63 and increase the speed and amount of traffic in which it is travelled. Duby asked if a speed limit could be posted on a dirt road. He also asked how the sand would be kept out of the newly constructed ditches.
 - Walker's crew cleans out the ditches and said the ditches have made a big difference.
 - Spanbauer said there was no plan to widen the road. The DEP has indicated they do not want to see paving.
 - Chief Leighton will be asked what the speed limit is on Four Mile Brook Rd.
 - Wood to keep a log on road issues.
 - Joe Stacy questioned the grant. Spanbauer said the grant was closed. One task left to do is a retention pond which will be done by the Highway Dept. Work continues on So. Mountain Rd. The truck traffic is no longer working on the Four Mile Brook Rd project. The So. Mountain Rd project will go on for a few more years.
 - Denis Brennan stated Four Mile Brook Rd. was underserved and has not been maintained in 50 years, except the middle. He asked Walker when it would be improved by widening and removing trees. Walker said some of the drainage improvements made the road narrower and only trees that have been storm damaged are removed. Brennan complained about the timely manner in which the road was plowed and graded; cited safety issues where the road is 12feet wide. Spanbauer explained about the expense of widening the road and there were areas that could not be widened due to wetlands. Proujansky agreed there were sections that could not be widened and disputed Brennan's statement that no effort had been made.
 - Paicos explained that nearly the entire road was under DEP permit and due to the extensive work just completed, the DEP would not issue additional funds for many years. Walker continued saying removing blind spots would require taking private property. Paicos explained about Chapter 90 funds and how the limited amount has to be spread to all town roads to be fair.
 - Bob English gave the Board a statement from the FMBWAC for the record with their opinion of widening the road.

 - Leighton requested Justin Moody be appointed as an auxiliary officer. He has completed academy training.
 - On a motion by Proujansky, seconded by Rogers the board VOTED unanimously to appoint Justin Moody as an auxiliary police officer pending pre- employment physical. Term expires 12/31/14
