




# **Spring Has Sprung!**

# News from the Town Clerk's Office

The total number of ballots cast for the presidential primary (by mail or in-person at the March 5<sup>th</sup> Election) was 732. There are 2,469 registered voters in Town, so this equates to 30% of voters participating in the election. Thank you to Amanda and Dan in the Town Clerk's Office who help to make all our elections run smoothly!

View Northfield results for the presidential primary, as well as candidates for State Committee, <u>on the Town</u> <u>website</u> under "Announcements." **The next election is on May 7, 2024.** You can check your voter registration online or in the Town Clerk's office. About 16% of the Town of Northfield is *not* registered to vote – so come see us if you need support getting registered!

Also, dog licenses are due by April 1<sup>st</sup>; there is a late fee incurred for any licenses requested after this date.

## Reminders from the Assessor's Office

- Real Estate and Personal Property tax bills are due April 1st, as well as Personal Property Abatement
  Applications. The Board of Assessors cannot accept late applications under any circumstances.
  Applications for abatements and exemptions are available online at <a href="http://www.northfieldma.gov/board-assessors">http://www.northfieldma.gov/board-assessors</a> OR are available outside of the Assessor's Office
- Payments can be made on the Town website visit <u>northfieldma.gov</u> and click this tab on the left side of the home page:
   Pay Bills-Taxes, Excise
- Friendly reminder when mailing in your tax payments: please send payments attention to the <u>Tax</u>
   <u>Collector</u>. There have been quite a few payments being sent to the attention to the Assessor's office. To ensure no delay in the receiving of your mailed tax payment, please be certain to send to the right office!
- Those age 65 + and Veterans with a Service-Connected disability rating of 10% more may be eligible for an Exemption on your Real Estate taxes. **All Senior and Veteran Exemptions are due April 1st.** Please call or stop by the Assessors office and Beth Walker will go over everything with you.
- Did you recently get rid of your motor vehicle or trade it in for a new vehicle? You may be eligible for an excise abatement and get a portion of your paid excise returned to you. Reach out to us for more info!

#### **Styrofoam Recycling Collection**

The Franklin County Solid Waste Management District is collecting Syrofoam blocks for recycling, on four Saturday mornings in April. Northfield residents can go to the Transfer Station (at 31 Caldwell Road) on the following days **between 9 a.m. – 12 p.m.** with their white foam packing blocks, sheets, and Styrofoam coolers:

- Saturday April 6
- Saturday April 13
- Saturday April 20
- Saturday April 27

No permit is required for this event; first-come, first-served.

On these same collection days, residents of Leverett, Montague, and Wendell can also bring their Styrofoam goods to their respective transfer stations. Tape, labels, cardboard, or wood must be removed from the items, and they should be clean and dry. Food-related items will not be accepted, nor packing peanuts, #4 (LPDE) foam, or insulation board (XPS).

## Veterans' Services on the Fourth Tuesday

The Upper Pioneer Valley Veterans' Service District advocates for veterans and their spouses, dependents, widows, or widowers for veterans' benefits at the local, state and federal levels. They assist veterans in filing for benefits like burial or death benefits, VA healthcare, property tax exemptions, military records, and more.

They also provide referrals for issues regarding homelessness, health, education, and employment; archival of discharges; discharge upgrade requests; and SHINE counselor assistance, which provides free health insurance information and counseling.

District Veterans' Services comes to Northfield Senior Center (in the Town Hall) every fourth Tuesday of the month from **9 to 11 a.m.** (**Tuesday March 26<sup>th</sup>**, and **April 23<sup>rd</sup>**).
